FAQ

What is bleed?

In our industry, printers do not print all the way to the edge. So if you're wanting artwork to go to the edge or "bleed", it'll need to be slightly bigger. We then print it on a larger piece of paper then cut it down to the size you're wanting. We ask for an eighth of an inch of bleed all the way around the artwork.

When do I need bleed and crop marks?

Generally we ask that you send us files "to size" as a pdf without crop marks. If your file needs to bleed you can make a "custom size" but add an eighth of an inch all the way around. For example, if you're wanting a 5x7, you'll make a "custom size" as a 5.25x7.25. Currently Canva does not give you the option to download with just bleed and not crop marks.

How far away should I keep my artwork from the edge of the paper?

We recommend that you keep about an eighth of an inch of "dead space". This is so our printers don't cut off your artwork when printing. It also helps us when cutting your artwork. Paper is prone to slightly sliding when cutting so that "dead space" helps us not cut into your artwork.
